

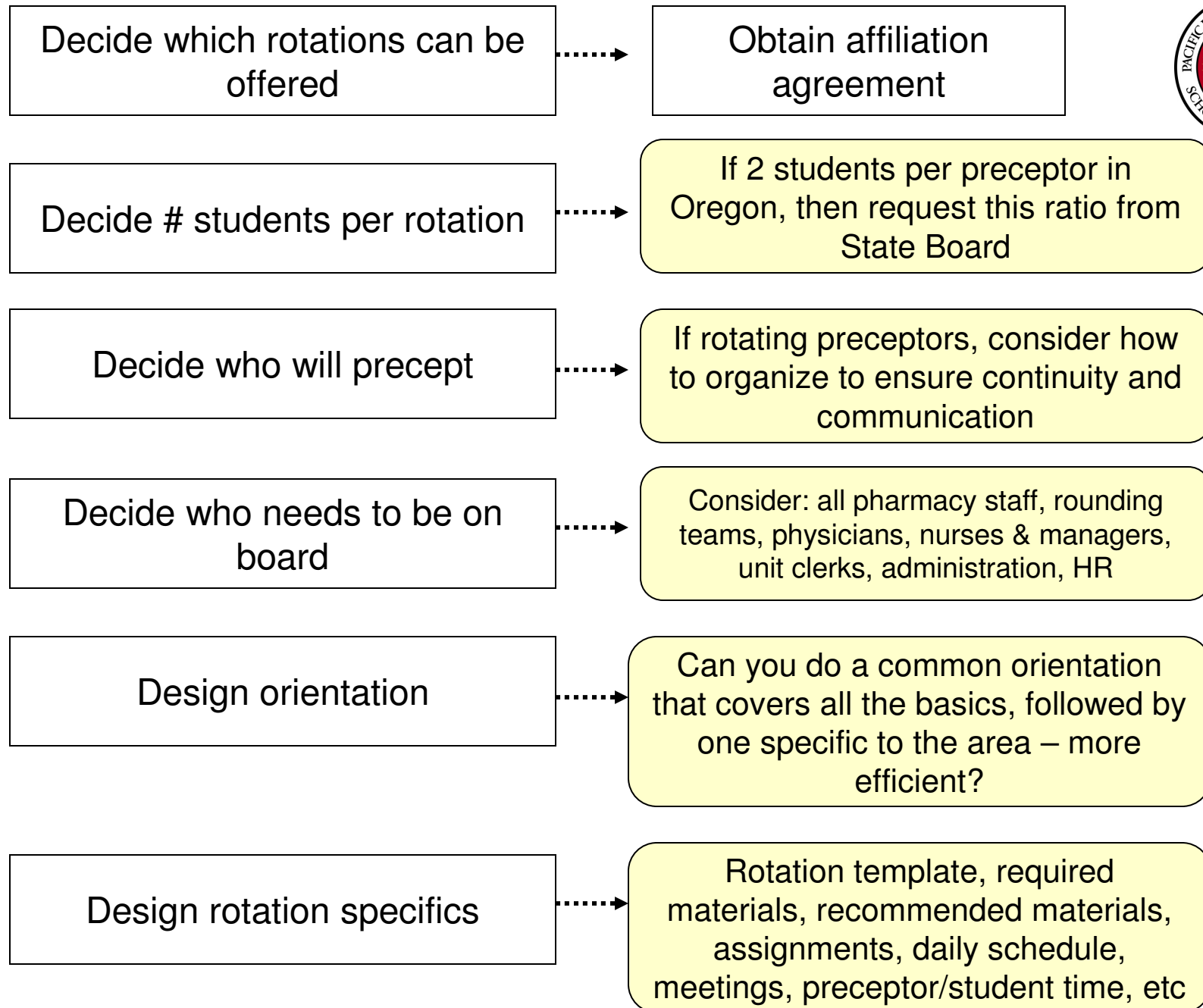


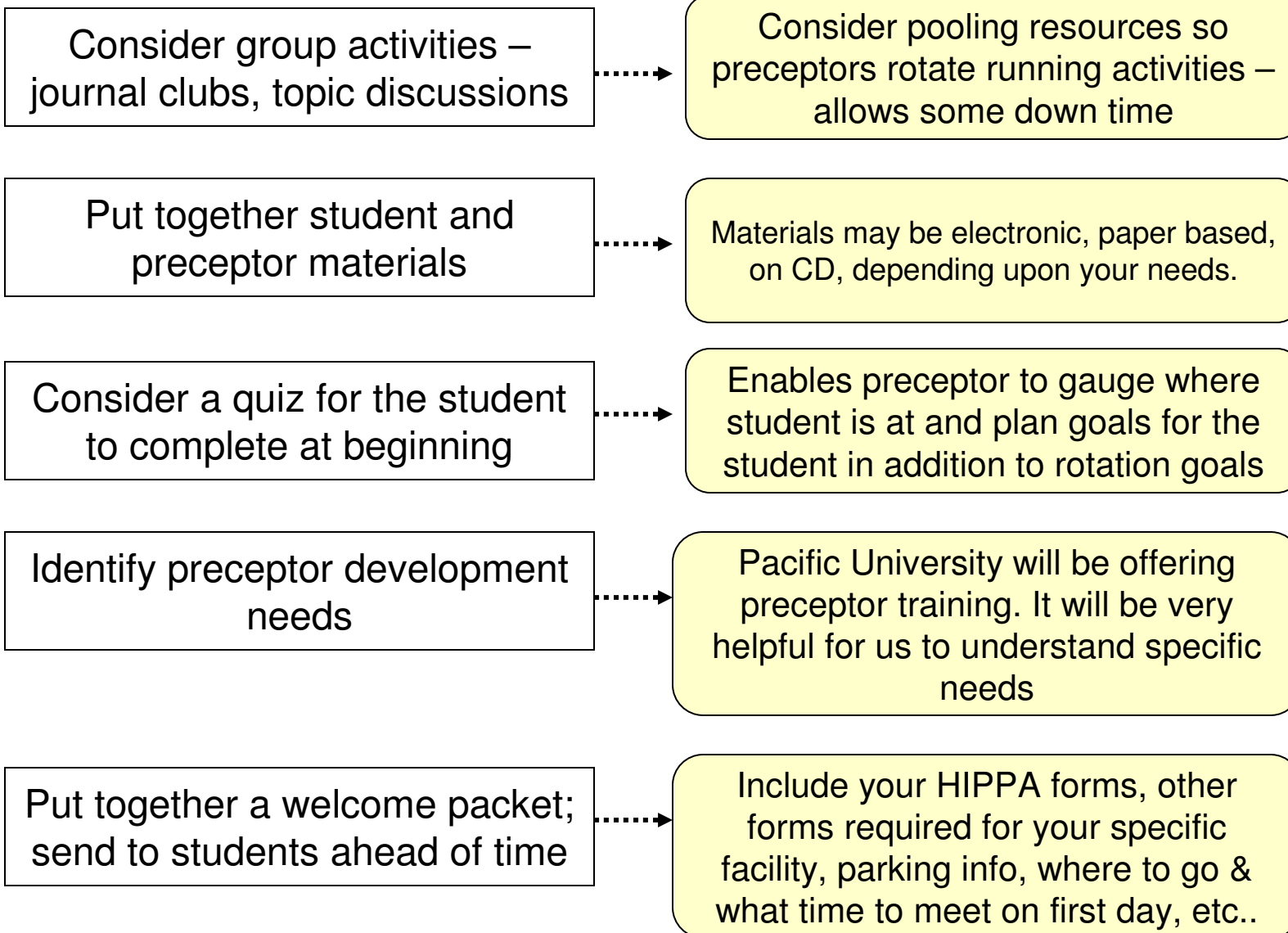

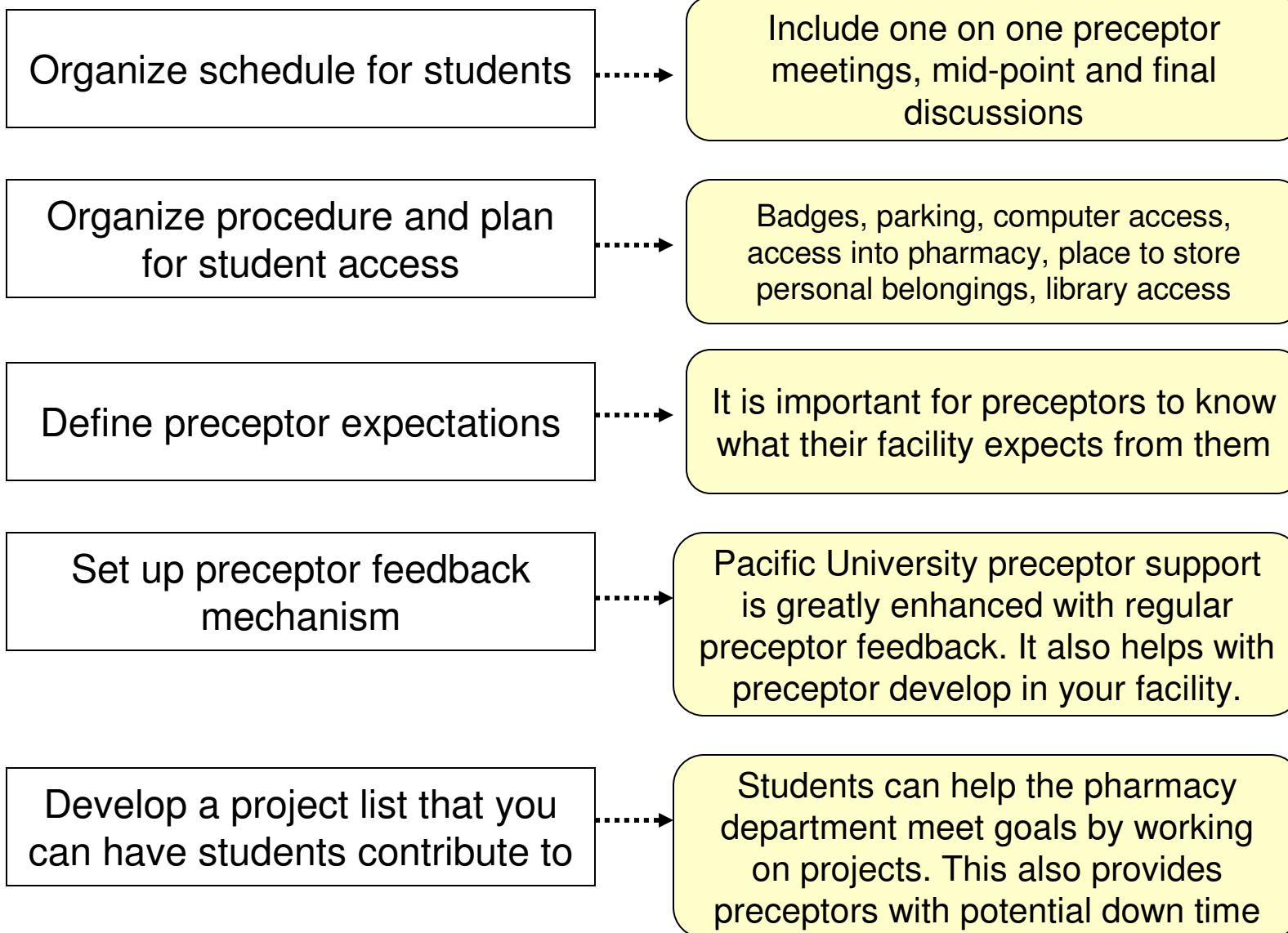

Consider students' role with your productivity and reporting



Do you wish to have students complete intervention reports, ADE reports, etc. Can student keep copies for their portfolio?

Consider developing rubrics describing desired performance



Pacific University preceptor development can assist with developing rubrics. A model is included in the preceptor packet.

Mechanism for preceptors to receive student feedback



Student feedback can be a valuable way to continually develop practice sites and rotations

Consider including preceptorship in competency programs



Pacific University will be providing preceptors with access to key teaching presentations which can be used for competency programs

Examine how precepting students has impacted staff and the department
