

**PACIFIC UNIVERSITY ATHLETIC TRAINING PROGRAM  
CLINICAL SITE REQUIREMENTS**

1. An athletic trainer, certified, and in good standing with the BOC, and who currently possesses the appropriate state athletic training practice credential must supervise the majority of the student's clinical education. The remaining clinical education may be supervised by any appropriately state credentialed health care professional.
2. Athletic training students must be instructed on athletic training clinical skills prior to performing those skills on patients.
3. Students must have one day off in a seven-day period.
4. All clinical education experiences must be educational in nature. Students will not receive any monetary remuneration during this educational experience.
5. Students will not replace professional athletic training staff or medical personnel.
6. Students must be directly supervised by a preceptor during the delivery of athletic training services. The preceptor must be physically present and have the ability to intervene on behalf of the athletic training student and the patient.
7. An active communicable or infectious disease policy as determined by the institution must be established and shared with the student.
8. Each site must provide proof that therapeutic equipment is inspected, calibrated and maintained according to manufacturer's recommendation, or by federal, state or local ordinance.
9. Blood-borne pathogen policies must be posted or readily available in all locations where the possibility of exposure exists and must be immediately accessible to students.
10. A detailed post-exposure plan that is consistent with federal standards and approved by institutional personnel must be provided to the students.
11. Students must have access to and use of appropriate blood-borne pathogen barriers and control measure at all sites.
12. Students must have access to and use of proper sanitation precautions at all sites.
13. All sites must have a venue-specific written Emergency Action Plan (EAP) that is based on well-established national standards or institutional standards.
14. Students must review Emergency Action Plans before they begin patient care at that site.
15. Students must have immediate access to the EAP in an emergency situation.
