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Students are advised to consult early with the Transfer Admissions Counselor and the Advising Center at Pacific University

A Pacific University Bachelor's Degree is comprised of 3 parts: Core, Major, and Electives

Core:

To complete the majority of your Pacific core requirements, it is strongly recommended that you earn the LBRT Associate of Arts degree at KCC. Students with this degree will only need to complete the Foreign Language, Writing, and Civic Engagement, requirements. Contact the Pacific Advising Center for more information about completing these requirements at KCC.

If you are not planning to earn the LBRT degree before transferring to Pacific then your transfer courses will be reviewed on a class-by-class basis towards meeting core requirements. Contact the Pacific University Advising Center for a transcript evaluation. At that time we can discuss selecting individual courses to meet our Core requirements.

Major:

The classes listed below will prepare you for your future business major at Pacific University. Completing these classes will allow transfer students to start their Junior level Business classes upon transferring to Pacific.

Pathways for Future Pacific Transfer Students in Business

1 st and 2 nd Year Major Foundation Courses at Pacific	KCC Transfer Equivalencies
Economics of Social Issues (Macro): ECON 101	ECON 131
Economics of Markets & Governments (Micro): ECON 102	ECON 130
Accounting Principles: BA 201	ACC 201
Managerial Accounting: BA 202	ACC 202
Statistics: MATH 207	MATH 115

The remaining requirements for Pacific's Business major are Junior and Senior level requirements. Taking additional Business classes at KCC is not recommended.

Electives:

Many classes will transfer as electives but you may need some electives at the Junior/Senior level. Anticipate taking at least a few electives at Pacific. Contact the Pacific Advising Center if you have questions.

- Only courses of "C-" or higher will be considered for transfer credit
- To graduate from Pacific you need 124 semester hours (186 quarter hours). 30 of the last 40 semester hours must be from Pacific.
- Quarter credits transfer at 2/3 credit, i.e. 90 quarter credits = 60 semester credits (junior class standing)
